5W aims to promote international friendship by encouraging women of different countries to visit one another in their own homes. Members are of all backgrounds and ages, from many parts of the world. Any woman can become a member, regardless of nationality, Religion or home circumstances.

5W is about

- * international friendship
- * learning how other women live
- * helping women grow in confidence
- * extending the vision of women and their families
- * being part of the international community of one world

Please complete and return this form to the 5W office, together with your membership donation and we will send you the latest membership directory. From there, the choice is yours - a 5W member can make new friends in foreign lands or just around the corner, travel to far-flung places or enjoy having guests in her own home.
Or just sit back and let the world come you by post, phone or email.

The Membership List

You will receive the most up-to-date membership list which contains information on every current member of 5W. There are almost 3000 members in over 80 countries, ranging in age from 16-90. They are housewives, students, single, professional, unemployed, retired; women who have one thing in common - a wish to make friends with other women around the world. It is up to you to choose how you make use of your list - how many members you contact, or where you travel.

To register as a 5W member

Please return your completed application form to 5W's international centre in High Wycombe, UK. Your details will be included in the membership list and circulated to all members throughout the world.

Individual visits

When you decide to travel, it is important to first write to or email the members whose names you select from the list. The best friendships are made when members have taken time to correspond before travelling. We recommend that the first visit should be short, in case it is not what you expect - lifestyles may be very different from your own! The visitor should fit in with the hostess and be prepared to entertain herself if necessary.

Get-Togethers

Get-Togethers are informal meetings of members. In some parts of the world they occur regularly through the year when local groups of women plan a programme of events for themselves. They can also be spontaneous occasions, such as when a traveller comes to stay and the hostess phones round local members and invites them to coffee.

Gatherings

Gatherings are arranged by a group of members together and can last from a single day to more than a week! Gatherings are announced in the Newsletter so that members from other parts of the world can plan to attend. Many 5W members have begun a visit to a far off continent at a Gathering and then arranged to stay with members they have met there.

There is always plenty of time to talk and get to know each other. Events might include learning a craft, working on a special project and visits to local places of interest. Costs vary according to the programme. Each Gathering has an individual character depending on country and organisers.

Email group

You can join the 5W members' email bulletin group - a fun and informative way of keeping in touch! Members also communicate individually by email and as penfriends.

Newsletters

Newsletters are sent out three times a year in January, May and September, with

- * news of forthcoming Gatherings and events
- * members' news and views
- * members' noticeboard
- * information from the office and Trustees

How is 5W financed?

Only by its members. There is no set subscription, but we suggest that members donate a minimum of £35 to cover the cost of maintaining membership, and a small contribution to the costs of others. Annual renewal is then £25 for continuous membership. If, for bona fide reasons, you are unable to afford this, please write to the office - we realise that there are countries in the world where members cannot possibly afford £35 and we are enriched by their membership. If you plan to travel and stay with 5W members accompanied by a non-member, please make an additional £25 donation to the office. You will receive your membership list, three newsletters throughout the year and some tips on enjoying your 5W membership. Little is spent on publicity; the enthusiasm of the members is our best advertisement, and we have been reported on radio and television, in newspapers and magazines.

What is a Trust?

The women who oversee the work of Women Welcome Women World Wide have formed a not-for-profit Trust and are called Trustees. They come from many countries and ensure the organisation works according to the "Deed of Trust". In 1998, they became a "Company Limited by Guarantee" (number 3682702). Their names are printed on the front page of the membership list. Moreover, it is appropriate that 5W should be constituted as a Trust, as every member needs to trust all the others. You, and every member, will have signed the pledge that you will not allow unauthorised access to your list. To give the names away is a civil offence in the United Kingdom; to sell them is a criminal offence. The Board of Trustees will take appropriate legal action if there is any abuse of membership. Each member is responsible for safeguarding the good reputation of 5W.

Ana, Cuba: "Through 5W I had known very interesting women, they are now my friends. When I'm sad about something or have a problem, a friend's letter comes and brings back rejoicing. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to meet nice friends all over the world."

Shirley, England: "It is the people I've met - friends now - from across the oceans, over hills, in valleys, beside rivers; the conversations I've had. I've learned to listen and to understand. Frontiers, borders mean nothing when women get together. I have gained the confidence to say what I feel - without embarrassment; to stand tall."

Maria, Italy: "I think that 5W makes the world become a small village in which to build peace and tolerance in a very easy and simple way; just by knowing each other, by writing to other members, meeting in small gatherings and trips. This is possible - peace passes through us."

How did 5W start?

When Frances Alexander's children were teenagers, they exchanged hospitality with other young people throughout Europe. She thought that women could have this opportunity too and wrote a paper about her idea.

Dr Patricia Niedzwiecki, then editor of *Women of Europe* - the EU information bulletin on women's affairs - assuming *Women Welcome Women* (as it was then called) was functioning, wrote a paragraph for the spring edition of 1984. *WoE* circulated all over the EU in each language. By the end of an influx of letters, there were 40 members in 5 countries. Frances circulated their names and addresses to all the new members. This has continued ever since, as the numbers near 3000 in 70 countries.

A leaflet was drafted and printed; a bank account set up; the leaflets were translated into several languages by the members. A constitution made Women Welcome Women into a Non-Profit Trust. Frances Alexander chaired the Board of Trustees for 12 years.

WWW moved from Frances's spare bedroom to a small office in High Wycombe in October 1995. In 1996, Jill Hilford from Sweden took over as chairwoman. In October 1998, the Trustees held an international telephone conference to accept the recommendations of a working party and became a Company Limited by Guarantee, adding *World Wide* to *Women Welcome Women*. Asta Cebulla from Switzerland was elected the first chairwoman. Sharon Giese from the USA is the current chairwoman.

*"Experiencing a different lifestyle is interesting, enriching and mind-opening. There are still people who regard **different** as **threatening**. Women have a gift for making friends and I know that 5W has, in its own way, made the world a smaller place. It pleases me that ordinary women travel the world, discover the joy of befriending people from very different cultures and learn about themselves at the same time in our web of international friendship."*
